Have Your Say on How Congleton's CIL Funding Should Be Spent

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a charge collected from developers when new developments are constructed. In Cheshire East, the levy is collected by Cheshire East Council and passed on to the relevant town or parish council for reinvestment in the local community. The law allows CIL monies to be spent on a wide range of infrastructure and community improvements, including play areas, open spaces, parks, green spaces, cultural and sports facilities, and community safety initiatives.



To date, Congleton Town Council has received £21,684 in CIL funding. At the Annual Town Meeting in May, town councillors discussed possible projects with residents who were in attendance and shortlisted three priority proposals for how this funding could be used to benefit the town:

- 1. **Pedestrian Safety Gates** Install gates on Bridge Street and Little Street to safeguard pedestrians and cyclists from vehicles during the pedestrianised hours of 10am–4pm.
- 2. **Public Realm Improvements** Invest in the maintenance and upgrade of bins, benches, signage, and other street furniture across the town centre.
- Public Toilets A contribution towards refurbishing the town centre public toilets (once legal transfer from Cheshire East has been achieved).



15th Congleton Jazz & Blues Festival


This year marks the 15th anniversary of the music festival – and it's set to be the biggest yet!



While Cheshire East maintains council-owned land, private homeowners are reminded to trim their boundary hedges. Clear paths mean safer streets for everyone. Now that nesting season is over, it's safer and legally appropriate to trim hedges.
